Barbara Marcine "Barbee" Tyler-Mullins was born in Clearwater, FL on March 20, 1966 and passed away at her home in New Kent County on November 12, 2015. She is survived by her husband Jim, and her adorable four year old twins Anne and Billy; her parents George and Sherry Tyler; a brother Robert Hugh Tyler (Blanca); a niece Portia; and her husband Jim's loving family.

Barbee attended public schools in Newport News, graduated from Hampton Roads Academy and The College of William and Mary. She spent the next year as an au pair in Switzerland, and then returned to work for 25 years at The Colonial Williamsburg Foundation. Barbee moved to Charles City County to occupy her grandfather's former home. She had many friends, some of whom were co-workers, and all of whom gave her their love and support during her illness. Barbee was kind, loving and courageous, with grace and a generous sprinkling of wit. She will be greatly missed by all who knew her. A memorial service will be held 11 a.m. Saturday, November 21, 2015 at Westover Episcopal Church, 6401 John Tyler Memorial Highway, Charles City, VA 23030. A light luncheon will follow at the parish house. In lieu of flowers, Barbee asked that donations please be made to support cancer research. There has been a Go Fund Me site set up for her children also.
