Gilbert Crist, known as "Papa Buddy" to his grandchildren, Nicholas, Shannon Krier (Ben), Nathan, Trenton, Brooke and Shane, passed away at his home in Lanexa on May 15, 2018. He died at home from complications of pancreatic cancer, while surrounded by his loved ones.

He served in the US Army in the military police branch at Camp Peary and later retired from there, after a 37-year long career as a civilian employee in the public works department.
