She also had a love for the Dallas Cowboys, especially when they were playing the Redskins, Dad's favorite team. Her son, Bob and his wife Gerianne introduced her to Tampa Bay Rays baseball and she enjoyed calling them after watching a game to discuss the plays. She loved flowers and was an avid gardener who could grow anything, bringing old tired plants back to life. Mom was employed by Farm Fresh for 10 years and then Walmart for 8 ½ years retiring in 2011 where many Gloucester residents were greeted by a warm smile from “Miss Verna”.
