



Alfonso John Lambiase

October 19, 1943 - December 23, 2022

Alfonso John Lambiase, age 79, died on Friday, December 23, 2022. The cause of death was due to complications after a fall at his home.

Mr. Lambiase was born October 19, 1943, on the Lower East Side of Manhattan, to Sam and Grace Lambiase. His family eventually moved to Staten Island, where he was a long-time resident before moving to Sea Bright, New Jersey and then to Lanexa, Virginia later in life.

Mr. Lambiase attended the New York School of Printing and graduated with Honors. He had dual careers. He worked at McGraw-Hill Publishing Co. for 15 years culminating his career as Director of the High School Books Division. He also served his country for 26 years in the United States Army and Army Reserve. Master Sergeant Lambiase was a member of the 24th Military Intelligence Battalion and completed the last three years of his career as an Army Recruiter. He later joined AmeriChoice, healthcare organization, and worked with seniors as a patient representative and advocate.

Mr. Lambiase was an avid antique automobile and motorcycle enthusiast and was a member of the Richmond Z Car Club. He also loved to travel and made several trips touring throughout Italy. He loved nature and enjoyed his home of 15 years in the woods on a lake in Lanexa. The last 7 years, he moved to a wooded neighborhood in Williamsburg, Virginia. It gave him great pleasure

and pride to stroll regularly through Colonial Williamsburg which was several blocks from his home.

He is survived by Suzanne Cox, his partner of 40 years, his sister Rose Braadt, his sons Matt Lambiase and Scott Lambiase and his three grandchildren.
