LANEXA- Charles N. Crump, 95, passed away Thursday, January 7, 2016. He was a lifelong resident of New Kent Co. and spent his entire life taking care of the family farm. Charlie worked for C&O Railroad for 41 years and was also a WWII veteran. He dearly loved trapping and gardening, and was a faithful member of New Kent Chapel and Pamunkey United Methodist Church. Charlie was preceded in death by his wife, Lucille P. Crump; and step-daughter, LaNette Boyd. He is survived by two step-sons, Rev. Gary W. Parsley, and Edward B. Parsley (Ruth Ellen); one granddaughter, Tammy Boyd; two grandsons, Bruce N. Parsley (Erin Willis) and Shawn E. Parsley (Sarah); two great-grandchildren, Nico and Addy; as well as a host of nieces and nephews.

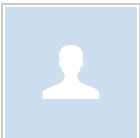
