David D. Seckora, 79, of West Point passed away March 4, 2022. Born to Frank and Rose Seckora in 1942, David served in the Army during the Vietnam War. He retired from Arcet as the service manager and was a member of Father Jakubowski Council #8116 Knights of Columbus. David was a selfless person and served his church and community as much as possible. He loved both fishing and gardening, especially growing vegetables for friends and family, and flowers to display in church. He also greatly enjoyed birds and loved to photograph them as they visited his bird feeders, particularly the hummingbirds.
