July 8, 1924 - November 28, 2013

Moore, Dorothea M. (Dot), 89, went to be with The Lord Thursday, November 28, 2013. She was preceded in death by her parents, Earl Adams Moore and Ethlyn Massey Moore. She is survived by her siblings, Edna A. Hill, Loyal S. Moore (Jean) and Kenneth E. Moore (Pat); three aunts, Ruth Massey Jenkins, Marie Massey Malcomb and Florence Massey, in addition to many nieces, nephews and cousins. Dot served her country during World War II in The Women's Army Corps. She graduated from Greenville College in IL, with a major in business education and a minor in music. Dot taught in the business department at Douglas Freeman High School for several years and lead the "Downbeats," a popular girls' choral group. After earning her master's degree from VCU, she served as a guidance counselor at Douglas Freeman. Early in her career she taught business and music at Pleasant Hill High School in King and Queen County. She was a longtime member of Immanuel Baptist Church before moving to Dallas, Texas in 1989, where she spent several years of retirement before moving back to Richmond. On an interim basis, Dot served as Immanuel's choir director. The siblings would like to express their deep appreciation to the staff at Sitter and Barfoot Veterans Care Center, the facility where Dot spent the last four years of her life, for the excellent care afforded their sister. A memorial service will be held at the Vincent Funeral Home, West Point Chapel, 417 11th St., West Point, VA on Monday, December 2, 2013 at 11 AM. The family will receive guests from 10-11 AM.
