“ We would always come to Virginia to see Fan and Russell about every other year growing up and Fan and Russell would come to Jackson on the opposite years and stay at the George Anna Motel. When we would go to Virginia Fan and Russell would make sure we had things to do like puzzles and games. They would take us places like to Kings Dominion, Williamsburg, Eastern Shore, Virginia Beach, Buckroe Beach, Jamestown, Chesapeake Bay Bridge Tunnel, etc. All the kids around would know we were coming and be in the driveway when we got there. When we were small the four of us would sleep on a pallet in the den and when we got older Merry and I would stay with Laura and Dale and Robert with Fan and Russell. The whole Pomfrey family was great to us. Every time we came their well would run dry and Gaven across the road would have to come work on it. A couple of things I remember the most is she always read road signs to Russell telling him when to stop and go. When I got older I realized she liked them read to her when she was driving and that was why I thought she read them to others, even my dad. The funniest thing I remember is we had gone to Eastern Shore and were going back over what i remembered as a really long bridge. We could not pull over and Fan said Russell honey are you getting dizzy. I almost had a heart attack at 12 or 13 or so, I was not a fan of bridges anyway, but we made it back in one piece. I really hate that I will miss her funeral, but I will be thinking about you all.
