Frank Phillip Waxmunski, 92, of West Point, VA died Monday, February 10, 2014.

He was a World War II Army veteran serving as a Sergeant in Company "B", 34 infantry, 84th division. Frank retired from Chesapeake Corporation after 42 years of service. He was an avid outdoorsman enjoying hunting, gardening and tending to his Purple Martin colonies.

Frank was preceded in death by his parents Joseph and Mary Waxmunski and his siblings, Joe, John, Fred, Henry, Edward, Tony, William, Emily and Rose.

He is survived by his wife of 62 years, Edna Thurston Waxmunski; two children and their spouses Dennis and Wendy Waxmunski, Susan and Don Todd: and a granddaughter, Emily Waxmunski.
