Frederick Martin Bennett, Jr., 70, of New Kent County passed away Friday, June 15, 2018.

He was an Army veteran who served in the Vietnam War and received the Bronze Star Medal and two Air Medals for outstanding meritorious service. Fred's citation accompanying the Bronze Star said that his loyalty, diligence and devotion to duty were in keeping with the highest traditions of the military service and reflected great credit upon him and the United States Army. He served his country from 1967 to 1970 with the 1st squadron 9th Calvary as a helicopter gunner and finished his military career as an instructor at Ft Eustis.

Fred was a devoted member and deacon of the York River Baptist Church where he was also a Sunday school teacher. He served as a Gideon and taught Bible study at Henrico County Jail. He was the original owner/operator of Kar Doctor, a mobile mechanic service in Williamsburg, VA. His favorite pastime was riding his Harley Davidson.

He was preceded in death by his father Frederick Martin Bennett, Sr; a son Sean Bennett; two sisters Nancy Stewart and Donna Klienmeyer and a brother Arthur Bennett.

Fred is survived by his wife of 51 years June Bennett; his mother Catherine Bennett; two daughters Renee Bennett Porter (Paul) and Lanee Bennett

Jones (Tommy); a son Scott Bennett; and was a proud Papa to six grandchildren Nathan, Anthony, Brandon, Christopher, Chelsea and Amber; five great-grandchildren Savannah, Madison, Liam, Aiden and Jase.

“ Like many others, I have so many great memories of Fred Bennett that I would nearly have to write a book to list them all, and yet most of those great memories were created within a span of only about five short years when we both attended York River Baptist Church in Croaker Va. That fact alone gives great insight concerning the positive influence, godly character, & integrity of Mr. Bennett. Fred was a strong, caring, and selfless man who set a tremendous example of selfless love & giving which most certainly inspired me personally. I have carried the memory of Fred, and one particular example set by him in my own life, along with me through many years which still helps to guide me to this very day! Twenty-three years ago, one Saturday morning in the spring of 1995, Fred Bennett pulled into our driveway with a few of his friends from York River Baptist Church. My wife Tammy & I barely knew any of them at the time because we were brand new members of that church. We were a young, basically newlywed couple doing our best to figure out how to balance our time between work, dream building, and trying to finish up what seemed like a million tasks still to be done in order to complete the new home we'd just moved into at the time. That, along with all of the other "life in general" things that we all face, seemed overwhelming to a couple of young newlyweds. I had begun to experience severe anxiety attacks during that time which often complicated things further. Fred Bennett cared enough about others to observe our situation and he recognized our struggle. So he set aside an entire Saturday, got a few friends together, and came to our rescue! He and that YRBC crew worked relentlessly the entire day and helped with every detail of finishing up the work that needed to be done around our new home just so we could call it "complete" because he knew that it would relieve much of our stress and allow us to move forward in life a little easier. Looking back, those "stresses" were small compared to what was ahead of us, but Fred Bennet was wise & compassionate enough to realize the encouragement that a little help would bring to a young couple and the impact it could have on their future together. Fred Bennett's kind, compassionate, & giving heart along with his always seemingly positive attitude impacted my life in many ways at

many times. However, that single act of kindness which I suppose could possibly be perceived by some as "relatively small", had a tremendous impact on my life and taught me a very rewarding lesson about the importance of giving one's time to reach out and help others. This is only one great memory I have of Fred Bennett but it was a tremendous life lesson for me which has enhanced my own life in more ways than I could have ever even imagined at the time!

God bless you Fred Bennett! May you rest in the loving arms of Almighty God & may your family be at peace knowing that you are safely and joyfully awaiting your sweet reunion with them in Heaven.

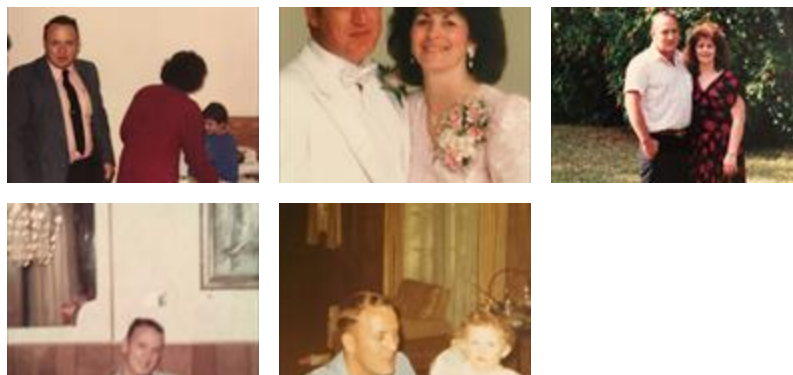

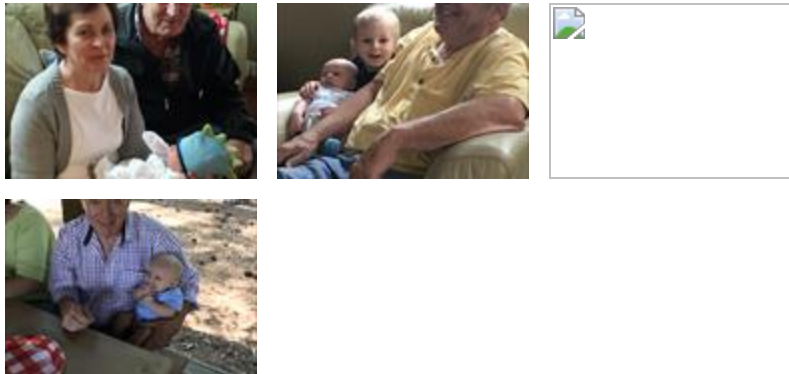
