Kenneth Carroll Moore, Jr., 84, of Providence Forge, passed away October 2, 2019. He was born November 7, 1934 in Kinston, NC to the late Kenneth Carroll Moore and Ruth Moore Kinosky. He was a 1952 graduate of Granby High School in Norfolk, VA and went on to attend Virginia Tech. Ken had a 37 year career with Verizon as a sales manager, was a President/CEO of Colonial Woodcrafters, Inc. and retired from Henrico County as a deputy sheriff. He was a member of the Fraternal Order of Police Lodge #4, a former member of the Royster Memorial Presbyterian Church in Norfolk, the Kempsville Presbyterian Church in Virginia Beach, the Providence Forge Presbyterian Church in Providence Forge, and was a current member of Fairfield Presbyterian Church in Mechanicsville. Through the years, Ken had served as both an elder and a deacon in the churches he was a member. Ken had served as President of the Kempsville Lions Club in Virginia Beach, was a former member of the New Kent Lions Club, a member of the New Kent County Republic Committee where he had been a past vice chairman, and a past secretary of the New Kent County Electoral Board.
