Lillian Walker Jones, 88, of Walkerton, passed away peacefully on February 9, 2021. She was preceded in death by her parents, Robert and Lucy Jones; brother, Robert Samuel Jones; and sister, Mary Lou Jones Borkey. She is survived by nieces Thelma Walker Jones Bailey (Buddy), Linda Jones Kocsis (Sewall), Anne J. Blake (deceased), and Pamela K. Borkey West (Donnie); great-nieces, and great-great nieces and nephews. Lillian graduated from Marriott High School in King & Queen County, Virginia, and attended Smith-Deal Massey Business School in Richmond, VA. Her first job was with the Division of Motion Pictures censoring movies. Lillian's first career was spent in Richmond working for the State Corporation Commission for 32 years. Known in her community fondly as "Miss Lillian" she spent her second career devoted to founding and working as an EMT on the Mattaponi Volunteer Rescue Squad. Lillian was a member of the Bruington Baptist Church where she played piano and organ for the church for most of her adult life. She also supported many others with her music for weddings and funerals throughout the area. She received numerous community service awards throughout her life for her dedication to the people of King & Queen and King William counties. Lillian was a caring and giving person who will be dearly missed. A graveside service will be held at 2 p.m. on Tuesday, February 16th in Bruington Baptist Church Cemetery.
