Raymond Larry Bassetti, 73, of Quinton, VA passed away on January 9, 2021.

Command Chief Master Sergeant Bassetti was born on June 3, 1947 in Philadelphia, PA. He was a highly decorated man of the utmost integrity and character who honorably served his God, country, community and family. In honoring Raymond's last wishes, his final dedication to service of others was his gift of life saving organ donation; which has already saved multiple lives. He was preceded in death by his parents, Emidio and Lois Bassetti and a brother, Vernon Bassetti.

Left to cherish his memory and legacy are his wife of 50 years, Glenda Bassetti; daughter and son-in-law Stephanie and Brendan Cashin; son, Steven Bassetti; three grandchildren, Rachel and Isabella Cashin and Lucas Bassetti; brother and sister-in-law, Marlon and Cathy Bassetti; sister, Carolyn Williams; one niece and three nephews.

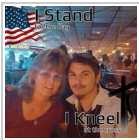

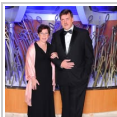
